Dear Colleagues,

It is with great pleasure that I announce the appointment of Angela Hawkins as the Associate Vice Chancellor-Campus Life, Facilities and Administrative Services (CLFAS) replacing Associate Vice Chancellor Stella Hsu, who will retire from UCSF at the end of this fiscal year. Angela's appointment is effective March 1, 2011 in order to provide overlap with Stella's remaining term, thereby providing continuity in management for this very large and critical portfolio of services.

The AVC-CLFAS oversees a full range of self-sustaining campus life services, as well as facilities management, the Financial and Administrative Services (FAS) Service Centers, and the strategic coordination for FAS. The range of responsibilities is diverse and involves services to all segments of the UCSF community (faculty, staff, students and visitors).

Since 2002, Angela has worked in the UCSF Office of Budget and Resource Management and currently serves as its Assistant Vice Chancellor. Prior to her current role, Angela served for seven years as the Associate Dean for Administration in UCSF's School of Pharmacy. In this capacity, she oversaw the business operations for the School and served on a number of committees that were focused on key administrative systems and processes across UCSF. She also currently serves as the co-chair of the UCSF Operational Excellence Finance Work Group.

Angela began her career with the University of California as an analyst in the Chancellor's Office at UCB, where she held positions of successive responsibility and progressed to the position of the Business Manager of Food Services, Housing and Child Care. She went on to UCSD to take the position as MSO in Anesthesiology. She later returned to UCB to serve as the Special Assistant to the Vice Chancellor and Associate Vice Chancellor-Business and Administrative Services (BAS). In this capacity, she led and managed the strategic planning and budget process for BAS which included auxiliary and business enterprises.

Angela received a Bachelor of Arts in Economics at UC Berkeley, graduating with *Departmental Honors, University Distinction and Phi Beta Kappa* and received a Master of Business Administration degree from the Haas School of Business.

Angela possesses a deep understanding of UCSF's culture, operations and financial structure and I am most grateful to have someone of her caliber and integrity in this important role. While it is difficult to imagine UCSF without Stella here, and she leaves very large shoes to fill, it feels somehow fitting that when she retires, she passes the baton to another longtime, and very valued member of our UC family.

Please join me in wishing Stella the best upon her retirement and welcoming Angela in her new role.
